

Pastor's Desk: Year End Reflections (part 2 of 2)

In last week's pastor's desk, we began the process of reflecting on the year that is about to be over. We started by reflecting on our 'personal walk' with the Lord. In case you missed it, here's the summary version:

How have I grown this year in godly character?

In what areas of sin and weakness have I remained the same or gotten worse?

How have I grown this year in conviction and devotion to Christ?

How have I grown in biblical and theological knowledge?

How have I grown in my ability to explain/defend/promote the gospel?

How have I gone with building relationships this year for the sake of evangelism and discipleship?

How has your prayer life been this year?

For this week, here are some questions to probe reflection on 'church life'

Have you been committed to church attendance this year? If you have, has it been due to a true understanding of the gospel that gathers us to God and each other or has it been more of a chore/'tick the box' mentality? If you haven't, why has commitment been lacking?

Have you grown in relationship with others in the church? Has there been a deepening of relationship? Have your relationships progressed in quality of interactions or has it remained superficial and distant? Do your interactions reflect a growing maturity in Christian understanding, deeper care, and prayerfulness? Have you resolved conflict in a Christ-like, grace-infused, humble and open way?

Have you grown or persevered in service? Has there been a growing desire to serve in different areas of the church? Have you been mindful of the needs of the church and sought to meet some of them? Have you dwelt upon and sought to develop your gifts so as to be able to meet these needs? Has there been joy in service or has service been marked by disinterest, frustration and/or resentment?

Here's some reflection questions to think through. Why not grab a piece of paper or open up a new document on your device of choice and write down your answers to these questions? Perhaps come up with more of your own. Even better, why not compare your answers to a close brother or sister in Christ in the church? And best of all, why not pray on your own and together with that brother or sister about all that you've reflected on? Hopefully there will be plenty of praise points, thanksgiving points, confession and supplication (asking for stuff)!

1. Walk in truth and love (v1-6)

Gospel Truth in 1 John:

- We are all sinners (1 John 1:8)
- But Jesus' blood cleanses all the sins of those who believe in Him (1 John 1:7; 5:13)
- So now in response to God's love, we love others as God loved us (1 John 4:7)
- And we keep fighting sin until Jesus returns (1 John 3:9; 5:18)

2. Watch yourselves that you abide in truth (v7-9)

3. Shun those who don't teach the truth (v10-11)
