## Indicatives and Imperatives of Romans 1-11

How practical have the first 11 chapters of Romans been for you? How often have you walked away from church, or discussed over lunch, the very real and practical steps in your studies, friendships, and (grand) parenting you will take during the week to live in response to God's Word? If you're anything like me then you probably haven't had many of these discussions!

There's a few good and bad reasons for that. Maybe one of the bad reasons is that we haven't been listening too well to the sermons. Well, we should prayerfully consider our hearts, and pray that God would work mightily in us to respond!

But I suspect that the more obvious reason is that many of these sermons in the first 11 chapters have not had, or held before us, specific, tangible, practical solutions and commands to our lives. Perhaps this is the fault of the sermons (I pray not!), but upon reflection and re-reading of Romans 1-11 I have noticed again the relatively sparse amount of commands from Paul (for the grammar conscious, there's been a lack of imperatives). Rather what Paul has spent a great deal of time upon are 'indicatives' - or to put it simply: the things that God has done for us. 11 chapters devoted to this—why would that be?

The pattern of 'indicatives first/imperatives second' is not restricted to Romans, but is pretty evident in all of Paul's letters, as well as the letters of the New Testament generally. There's good reason for that too: we need to constantly heart the truths of the gospel in all their vividness, complexity, and sheer incomparable awesomeness. And we need to hear these truths constantly because our sin-stained hearts are prone to forgetting. We are prone to forgetting and assuming what God has done for us in Jesus—and when we forget we end up prioritising or emphasising our works. This is why the antidote to a work's based faith is not 'do nothing', but a recapturing of the centrality and priority of the gospel.

Many indicatives we have covered so far—the fallenness of humanity and our utterly desperate need for salvation. God's response in Jesus: to present him as the wrath-turning (propitiation) substitutionary sacrifice in our place, placing our sinfulness upon Jesus and in exchange being given Jesus' righteousness. We are assured of this exchange by faith, which does lead to living for him (cf Romans 6), and resounds to his praise and glory. And we can be assured that God will keep his word on this matter, even in the face of the seeming failure of a similar word to his people, the Jews (cf Romans 9-11).

Returning to these truths again, and again, is what will anchor our lives as we seek to live out the many imperatives that Romans turns to (Romans 12-16). Hence why even the first imperative in response to the gospel truth of Romans 1-11 is to begin with renewed minds. What we believe is just as important as how we live.

Let us be encouraged, then, to keep pursuing a deeper, richer, more grounded faith in the knowledge of Jesus and the gospel, and then let us be encouraged to work hard at applying these rich truths to our lives. Pray that as we explore the remaining chapters that the good works we are encouraged to pursue will be done so from a profoundly rooted knowledge and faith.
