A Wasted Life?

In the past week there were two fascinating events that gained media attention. The first was the sad news that missionary John Chau lost his life as he tried to contact the Sentinelese people. The second was a stunning incident last month of American man Chris Gursky who was 'lucky' to survive a near fatal mistake in which his hang gliding instructor failed to strap his harness in properly before taking off—leaving Gursky to cling perilously to the craft and his instructor, by his hands (for a gruelling 2min and 14secs), as they made an emergency landing.

Both of these men made willing choices to end up in situations that put their lives on the line. Both cases had what appeared to be errors of judgement. But in the case of Gursky the news reports were filled with astonishment and relief—Gursky managed to live to tell the tale. If he had lost his life it would have been a tragic accident, an inquiry probably held, but in all most people would probably have sympathised with the error in judgement.

In the case of Chau there has been very little sympathy. For those unaware, Chau died at the hands of the Sentinelese people—an indigenous pre-Neolithic tribe living on an isolated island near India. The Sentinelese have gained a reputation not only for being one of the last stone-age tribes, but also for being violently protective of their island, killing all who dare make contact. Hence India has made contacting them illegal.

Criticism against Chau was swift—even from Christians, labelling his effort foolhardy, reckless and a wasted life. This quick condemnation however has since proven to be rather judgemental as Chau's missions organisation (All Nations) has clarified that Chau went in very prepared, was vaccinated (and quarantined) appropriately, and had an enormous heart for the Sentinelese to know Jesus.

In the eyes of this world the potential death of Gursky would have been tragic, but the death of Chau fanned the flames of hostility at Christians and missionary work. For Christians with a biblically informed worldview we must see things very differently. For us, the potential death of Gursky is a stark warning that we all face inevitable death and judgement—and every moment we are not taken now is a moment made for repentance and for worshipping God.

And for us the death of Chau is not something to condemn. A life spent in mission for the gospel of Jesus is never foolish, nor a waste. Over 60 years ago another young man named Jim Elliot lost his life to the people he was trying to reach out to. Prior to his death Elliot wrote, 'He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep in order to gain what he cannot lose.' A life spent in serving the Saviour who gave his life for us is no wasted life.
