Chosen to Receive and Obey (Luke 19:1-10)

If you look carefully, you will see the outline of the Christian life in this story of the wee little man named Zacchaeus. It begins, as our spiritual journeys with Christ often do, with Zacchaeus considering Jesus. He has gone to "take a look" at this man whom many are worshiping and following. Before we are saved, we tend to do the same. We "take a look" at Jesus. What did he say? What did he do? Are the things Christians believe about him true? If we're really interested, we will get as close a look as we can, climbing our own sycamore trees by going to church, reading books, talking with Christian friends, and so on.

But salvation begins not when we "take a look" at Jesus but when Jesus takes hold of us. Jesus spots Zacchaeus and says, "I see you, little man. Come on down; I'm going to come to your house." If Jesus had not done this, would Zacchaeus have "received him joyfully"? (Luke 19:6). Maybe. Maybe not. In any event, we see here that the life of discipleship begins not when we choose Jesus but when Jesus chooses us (John 15:16). But this doesn't mean we have no part to play—oh, no!

When Christ calls his spiritual siblings, the call has great effect. We worship Christ when we finally see him for who he truly is. We're no longer "considering" Jesus, but we have gotten some glimpse of his glory, and it has changed us (2 Cor. 3:18). We hear the good news, and it strikes us for the first time as good news! It strikes us as good news that is for us. So, like Zacchaeus, we receive Jesus gladly. He is coming to receive us, and so we receive him. He is entering our heart, so we rejoice at the bigness of his own heart, that the very God of the Universe would choose a man of such small stature to be his friend, to be his brother! What a great joy.

But we do not stop there. No, the disciple of Jesus, seeing the great satisfying joy there is to be had in him alone, is willing to give up whatever is required. Having Christ, we have all. So we can consider everything else a loss (Phil. 3:7). Zacchaeus immediately begins giving back what he has sinfully taken, and more besides.

When Jesus saves a man, he saves him into a life of joy and obedience, of joyful obedience.
