#### Reflections on Jonah-by Faith Ho for Sunday School Primary

One of the things SLE Church values is bringing and teaching the gospel to the children amongst us. Sunday School is not seen as a childcare or child-minding service, but a ministry where, week after week, God's Word and the gospel are explained and discussions are had regarding how we can live in faith and repentance in response to what we hear. It doesn't sound very different from what goes on 'upstairs' (which is what the adult service is often referred to) - and that's because it isn't! Sunday School is really Kids Church, which is why we are moving towards renaming and rebranding Sunday School!

Amongst the primary aged children, we also have been going through the book of Jonah like you! The story of Jonah is often taught poorly in most children's bibles. The pagan sailors and their response and the whole of chapter 4, is often completely left out! It has been an exciting opportunity for the children to read the REAL story of Jonah for themselves in the REAL bible!

In Jonah 1, the kids learnt that "God is in charge, so fear him! Don't just say you do!"

# In Jonah 2, they learnt that *"No one deserves God's kindness. But God shows mercy and saves them anyway by sending Jesus."*

Just like you have discussion questions at the end of the sermon, so the children have 'Chat Time' questions to reflect on and discuss after hearing God's Word. Here are some of the 'Chat Time' questions from last week. Perhaps you could think about what your answers might be!

- 1. Johnny goes to Sunday School and knows a lot about the Bible. He's a pretty good kid. When he sins, he often thinks they're pretty small sins compared to his brother who always sins and his friends at school, who doesn't even know about God. What would you say to Johnny?
- 2. God is very kind to not give us the punishment we deserve. But it's easy for us to be like Jonah and take his mercy for granted. Take the 'Jonah Test' to see if you are like him.

What do you usually do when you sin?

- You admit you have done something wrong straight away
- You admit you have done something wrong only when someone makes you
- You feel guilty straight away
- You don't usually feel very guilty/bad
- Tell God what you've done wrong straight away
- Confess your sins only on Sundays when you have to write a 'Sorry' prayer
- You only say sorry when you've done something really bad
- You don't usually say sorry when it's only a small sin
- You feel better when you compare yourself to someone worse.

Zoe (age 7) writes about what she's learnt about God in Jonah:

Something I've learnt about Jonah and ourselves is that we're all just like him. We are all as good as dead. We should all be punished, but God decides to show <u>MERCY</u> on us. I also learnt that <u>MERCY</u> means that you should be punished, but you don't get what you deserve. God is very good at showing <u>MERCY</u> to us as He is very loving.
